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Colonel William Seck was appointed by the governor in 2003 to lead the Patrol. In 2005, Governor Sebelius appointed Col. Seck and Kansas Bureau of Investigation Director Larry Welch to co-chair the Kansas Task Force on Methamphetamine and Other Illegal Drugs.

The Superintendent oversees the agency's operations and its 800-plus employees. He also serves as the chairman of the Governor's Council on Homeland Security.

The Superintendent's responsibilities include:

- Leading policy and enforcement initiatives
- Advising and managing administrative staff
- Governing operations of the organization

The Superintendent also acts as a liaison to the following:

- Governor Kathleen Sebelius
- Kansas Legislature
- Kansas State Troopers Association
- Local, state and federal law enforcement agencies
- The public

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT



Lieutenant Colonel Terry Maple joined the Patrol in 1979 and has served as Assistant Superintendent since 1999.

The Assistant Superintendent administers day-to-day operations of the Patrol and submits information and recommendations for approval by the Superintendent.

Responsibilities of the Assistant Superintendent include:

- Coordinating and managing activities of administrative staff and field majors
- Monitoring the effectiveness of the Patrol's programs
- Acting as a liaison to government officials and to local, state and federal law enforcement agencies
